PART -A

Theme: With grateful heart let us remember our faithfully departed brothers and sisters and pray for them.

Quotes found in the cemetery:


- 1. "Today is my turn, tomorrow yours"

(A cross is kept on the table with birth and death date written, reminding the crosses at the graves in the cemetery)

For a moment let us remember our family members and friends who are dead.

Introduction:

The month of November always reminds us of our departed brothers and sisters. On the 2nd of this month, the Holy Catholic Church remembers them, offers thanksgiving prayers and intercedes for them. All of us love and remember our faithful departed deep from our mind and heart. Death has separated them from us. In today's meeting let us remember them with gratitude and ask our Heavenly Father to grant them eternal rest.





Dialogue between some ladies who were coming from a funeral service.



Lady 1 : Did you know how she died? Didn't she die at a very young age?

Lady 2 : Whatever her life may be, God should not have called her so

early.

Lady 3 : By whom is she survived? I hope they imitate her goodness.

Lady 4 : Lawfully or unlawfully, she has accumulated a lot of wealth for

her children. I hope it profits them.

Lady 5 : The previous funeral had very less attendance. Today, there were

many people. What grand funeral celebration they had? Posh undertaker, choir, funeral band and coffin. Many were seen

crying.

Leader:

Many times, this is our dialogue at funeral services, but the truth remains that the person is no more and will never be seen anymore. Dust and unto dust he or she has returned. Now there is no more seeing, listening and speaking. What kind of dialogue do we need to have:



- 1. What good memories did our departed brother or sister left for us and what good memories will I live?
- 2. What good qualities have I learnt from my departed brother and sister and what good will I teach as I live?
- 3. They have departed, am I ready?



(Leader) Request some of the members to offer flowers and candles to the cross, kept in front of them, remembering the departed members of the Small Christian Communities.


What do our departed brothers and sisters need from us? What do they ask of us? Let us now reflect it in the light of the word of God.

1. **Good life.** If they are in heaven, they would want all of us to come there and if at all they are in *inferno* or Purgatory, they will plead us not to come there. Jesus in the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, cautions us to live a good life.

Let us now read the Word of God. Lk. 16. 19-31

2. They want us to pray for them.


- a) Let us offer masses for them and participate in the same.
- b) Let us visit their graves and the cemetery, in doing so, let us pray for them and gain plenary and partial indulgences.
- c) Pray for them in your personal prayer





Let us now read the Word of God wherein:

3. They want us to live in love

- → Speak words of love when your mouth is still open.
- → Tell them the stories of love when their ears are still open.
- → Look at them in love when your eyes are still open.
- → Do actions of love when your hands and legs are still moving.





Jesus teaches us a proper attitude in life through His sermon on the mount i.e. the beatitudes.

Leader: Let us now share our pleasant memories of our departed family members, our relatives and our friends. Share what they have done to you. (Gift of life, good relationship, companionship, care, concern, love, house, properties, business, good name, good qualities, good example, medicines, etc). Let us now thank God for all the good things He has done for us through our departed brothers and sisters and sing the hymn *O give thanks to the Lord for He is good*.

Leader:

What do our faithful departed brothers and sisters teach us?

- 1. This world is not our eternal home. We have to leave it, don't cling to it.
- 2. Dust we are and unto dust we shall all return. Cherish your imperishable soul.
- 3. Do good when the person is alive. Good words, good actions and good memories.
- 4. Do not fear death, but prepare yourself for it.
- 5. Keep good memories, never evil. Be a blessing and not a curse.
- 6. You belong to God. So, your life on earth be.
- 7. Collect riches which will merit you heaven i.e. Blessings, good deeds and purity.
- 8. Learn to live together in harmony.
- 9. Pray for one another
- 10. Hand in hand, let us march to heaven.
